

Eldora City Council  
Special Council Meeting - Condensed  
June 29, 2020 -- 6:00 pm

The council gave the option to meet via Zoom or in the council chambers due to the Governor's State of Public Health Disaster, eliminating groups of more than 50% capacity and social distancing.

Eldora City Council met in Special Session with Mayor David Dunn presiding. Council members Cindy Johns, Melody Hoy, Blake Jones, Aaron Budweg, Greg Priske and Mayor David Dunn were present. Aaron, Greg, Cindy, David, and Chandra were present in the council chambers and Melody and Blake were on Zoom. Also, present by Zoom were M. Harrell, Jim Edwards, Renee Springston and Terry Weatherly. Present at the council meeting were Jerry Kramer, Michael Pearce, Sarah Carson, Matt Rezab and David Burk.

The meeting started with the Pledge of Allegiance. The Mayor asked for a motion to open the public hearing on the City Budget Amendment and Council member Johns so moved, seconded by Priske. Roll call vote: "ayes": Budweg, Priske, Jones, Johns and Hoy; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried. The public hearing opened at 6:03 pm. There were no public comments and the Mayor asked for a motion to close the public hearing. Council member Budweg so moved, seconded by Hoy. Roll call vote: "ayes": Jones, Johns, Priske, Hoy and Budweg; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried. The public hearing closed at 6:05 pm.

Mayor David Dunn asked for a motion to accept the consent agenda. Council member Johns motioned, seconded by Priske to approve the consent agenda. The consent agenda approved consisted of the fiscal year end claims, refuse permit for Green RU LLC, Stone Sanitation and Knights Sanitation and the tree trimming permit for Affordable Tree Service. Roll call vote: "ayes": Johns, Priske, Hoy, Jones and Budweg; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried.

Mayor David Dunn opened the citizens comment period and Jim Edwards and Terry Weatherly spoke on banning fireworks within the City limits. They are set off after hours, there is alcohol involved, the debris does not stay on their property and some of them can be quite loud.

The council held the second reading of Ordinance 868 on Chapter 41, section 41.11 Fireworks. Council member Johns motioned, seconded by Priske to approve the second reading. Roll call vote: "ayes": Priske, Hoy, and Johns; "nays": Jones and Budweg; absent: none. Motion carried. Council member Priske motioned, seconded by Hoy to suspend the rule of another reading at a later meeting and hold the reading today. Roll call vote: "ayes": Priske, Johns and Hoy; "nays": Budweg and Jones; absent: none. Motion did not carry. A vote of 4/5 was needed.

Resolution 07-20-2888, Resolution amending the current budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020. Council member Hoy motioned, seconded by Johns to approve Resolution 07-20-2888. Roll call vote: "ayes": Johns, Priske, Budweg, Jones and Hoy; "nays": none; absent: none. Motion carried.

Council member Priske motioned, seconded by Johns to approve the lease agreement with McFarland Clinic. This is a two-year lease with no change for 6 months, an increase the next 6

months and another increase for the June 21-July 22 year. Roll call vote: “ayes”: Budweg, Hoy, Jones, Johns and Priske; “nays”: none; absent: none. Motion carried.

The Greenbelt Home Care (GHC) lease will be discussed at the GHC board meeting on July 13<sup>th</sup> and will be on the July 14<sup>th</sup> council meeting. The Union Contract members will have another meeting on July 1<sup>st</sup>, so the Union Contract and Resolution 06-20-2892 on wages will be approved later in July.

The council discussed Resolution 06-28-2889, Resolution establishing street closing for Pine Lake Festival Motorcycle Show at Memorial Park. The council moved the street closing area from just south of the restroom and going north to 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue. This way leaving parking for those who would like to visit the park, Welcome Center or Vet Memorial. The Motorcycle Show is also checking with Steamboat Rock council about having the event on their main street. Council member Budweg motioned, seconded by Priske to approve Resolution 06-20-2889. Roll call vote: “ayes”: Priske, Budweg, Johns, Hoy and Jones; “nays”: none; absent: none. Motion carried. Council member Budweg motioned, seconded by Priske to approve the liquor license for the Motorcycle Show. Roll call vote: “ayes”: Hoy, Budweg, Priske, Johns and Jones; “nays”: none; absent: none. Motion carried.

Resolution 06-20-2890, Resolution to close the street for the American Legion Pine Lake Festival was not needed. The Legion will not be needing the street this year, it would be hard for someone sitting on the west end of the street to see the band. Resolution 06-20-2891, Resolution to close a partial street for the Eldora Firehouse Pine Lake Festival was discussed. 19<sup>th</sup> Street in front of the Firehouse will be blocked off and an egress for the homeowner left. The homeowner has already been talked to and is alright with this arrangement. This will give the Firehouse more room for social distancing. Council member Johns motioned, seconded by Priske to approve Resolution 06-20-2890. Roll call vote: “ayes”: Johns, Priske, Jones Budweg and Hoy; “nays”: none; absent: none. Motion carried.

The council members gave their communications at this time. Dan Brekke gave the council a letter on the bill he received for a fire call on his property at 27867 255<sup>th</sup> Street.

Mayor Dunn asked for a motion to adjourn. Council member Johns so moved; meeting adjourned at 6:51 pm.
